She was never one to put herself first despite all of the health issues she endured. Her children were always what she valued most and one could easily tell by the life she lived. Unfortunately, over the last five to ten years of her life, health complications began to take their toll. Even through these struggles she always had a way of making everything seem okay. These complications spoke a lot of her character. She was strong. She persevered. She never stopped loving. She did anything she could to make sure her family was taken care of. She was a hero, and she was a fighter. She'll be sadly missed, but her soul lives on in the hearts of her family and friends, as well as in the gates of heaven above. 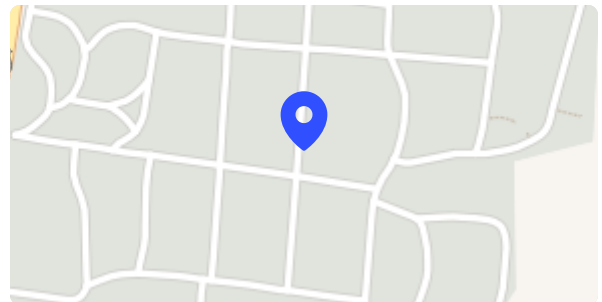
