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Wallace Edward Young, age 67 of Nashville, passed away March 10, 2015 at his home surrounded by his loving family.

He was born August 11, 1947 in Nashville to the late Joe Trotter and Annie Gertrude Meadows Young. Besides his parents, Wallace is also preceded in death by his loving wife of 38 years, Gloria Ann Marie Choate Young and granddaughter, Estelle Ann Marie Young.

Wallace served his country in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam Era. His family remembers him as a hardworking man. After serving five years in the Army, Wallace drove a truck for Shoney's and Elm Hill Meats. He was an advocate for the mental health field, and spent much of his life as a caregiver at Centerstone Mental Health Facility. Wallace and his wife were foster parents from 1976 until his passing, and he regularly attended 11th Street Church of Christ.
