Age 92. Born on October 24, 1923 and died on November 23, 2015 at the Barton House in Nashville after a battle with Alzheimer's disease. Known to family members as "Aunt Georgia", she was married to her late husband Richard Morris Evans for 70 years. Morris died in July 2015. Georgia and Morris didn't have children of their own, but were loved dearly by numerous nieces and nephews and large extended family. Georgia is survived by nephew Roy E. Smith, Jr. (Cathy) and nieces Patricia Phipps (John) and Marilyn Burney (Michael). They along with their children and grandchildren all loved "Aunt Georgia" and considered her a grandmother. Georgia is also survived by her brother, Claudie (Carol) Phillips. 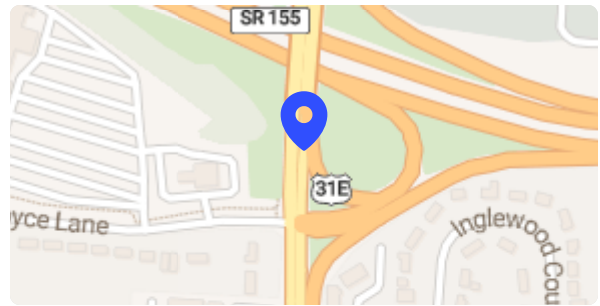
