Carter Alexander Howard, age 71, passed away on Monday, January 11, 2021. He was born July 20th 1949.

Survived by his wife of 50 years; Pamela C. Howard, daughter Mitsi (Keith) Lindsay, daughter Anita (Travis) Simpson. He is also survived by his grandchildren; Cole Simpson, Alli Simpson, and Charlie Lindsay. Additionally, Carter always considered his nephews, niece, & life-long friends as family.

Preceded in death by his mother, Jan Howard; his brothers, Jimmy Howard and David Howard. He proudly served his country in the United States Army as an Airborne Ranger in the 101st Division "Screaming Eagles."

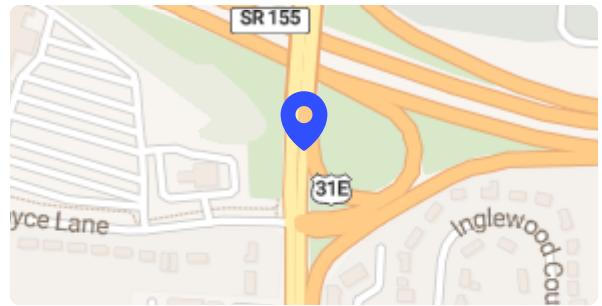

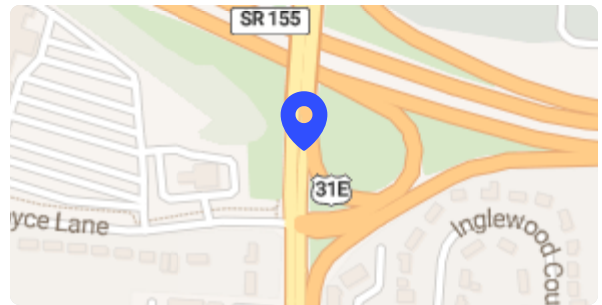
