Barbara Anne (Roller) Hendrix age 78 years of Nashville, TN, left our world bound for heaven on April 6, 2021. She passed away peacefully at home after a fight well fought against cancer. Barbara was born in Nashville, TN on November 18, 1942 to Frank & Martha Roller.

A true Tennessean, Barbara lived her whole life in Nashville, TN. Upon graduating from Litton High School, she worked at the Nashville Gas Company before she began her life's favorite work as housewife and mom to her three children. Once her children were older, she worked as a Crossing Guard for the Metro Nashville Police Department where she retired. Her fun job later in life was being a cashier on the General Jackson Showboat for over 20 years.

She married her husband Jimmy of 56 years in September 1964. 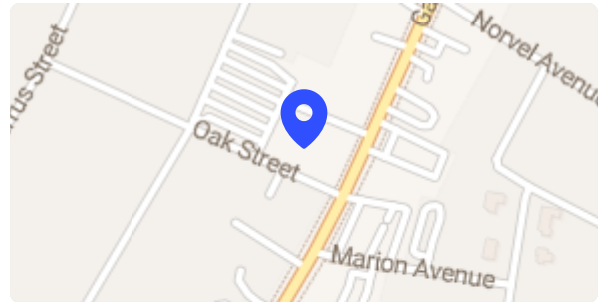

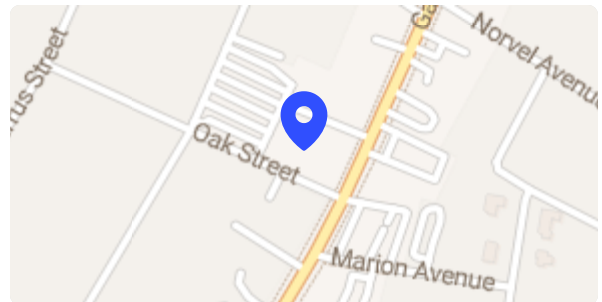

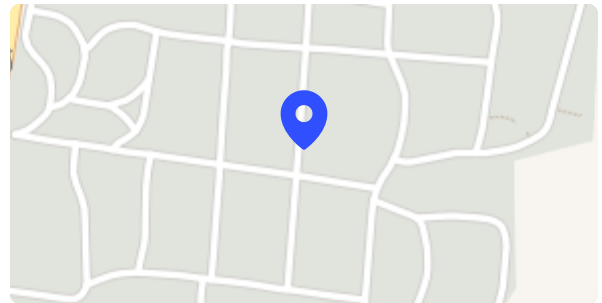
