She served as their personal secretary for over 40 years, and was also a longstanding member of the Madison Chamber of Commerce. 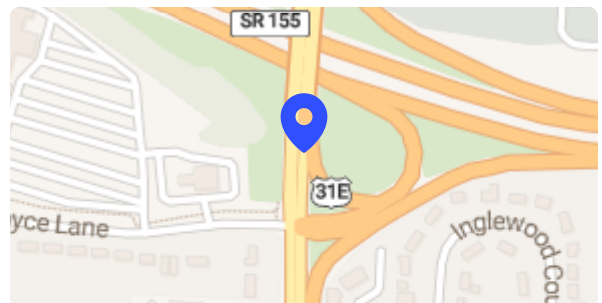
