A funeral service will be held from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM on 2023-09-03 at Spring Hill Funeral, 5110 Gallatin Rd. .

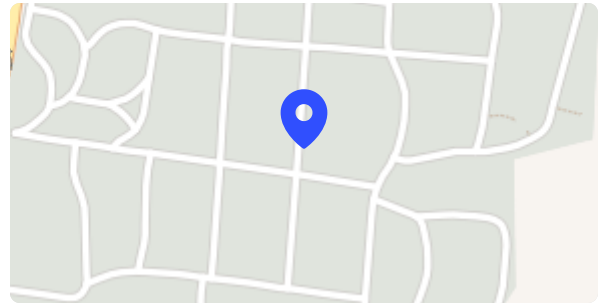

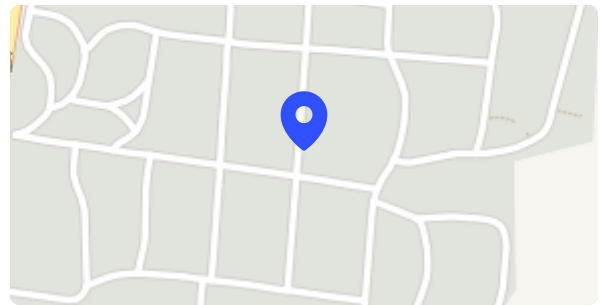

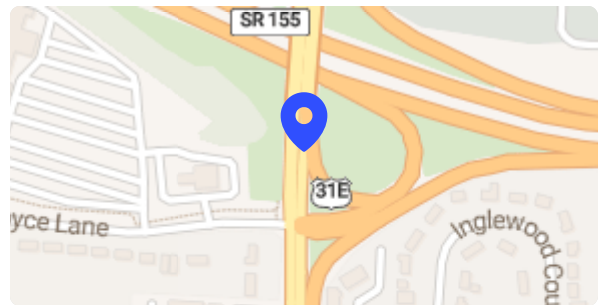
