Larry Wayne Eaton, 69, of Gallatin, Tennessee, passed away on Tuesday, January 5, 2021. Born July 25, 1951 in Decatur, Illinois, he was the son of the late Eual Thomas Eaton and Alyne Virginia Robinson.

Larry was a retired salesman having worked in auto sales and construction in Texas and Tennessee.
